We had an Advisory Workshop in February.

People in the workshop:

- Shared some traumatic experiences they had faced, for example being bullied
- Felt that trauma informed care was important
- Mentioned that genetic information could be hard to understand
- Shared ideas to make genetic information easier to understand, for example social stories

People recommended using:

- positive language, for example use the word "condition" instead of "disorder"
- different ways to communicate with people who don't use verbal language, for example key signs
